

Known for her grunge textures and unique carvings, she employs evocative forms and inscriptions in her works to comment on self, culture and societal values as they affect individual and collective consciousness. Interested in the complexity of human interactions and their expression, she comprehends the world from the inside-out, intrigued with the murky, messy parts of life.

Self taught; on a journey of self discovery; her curiosity about the nature of materials brought her to ceramics where she is captivated by the way matter can be transformed through process. Her current work is influenced by nature, emotions and culture where records of intimate collected histories lay.

Olubunmi studied Adult Education at Adekunle Ajasin University and consults as a communicator before her artistic debut in 2022. She bagged the prize for Technical Proficiency at Life in my City Art Festival the same year.


Her work is a testament to the fusion of self, heritage and information practice.


Chigozie Obi (b. 1997) is a multidimensional artist whose practice delves into multifaceted materials to narrate stories influenced by personal and societal encounters.






'Laja (b. 1997) is a lagos based multidisciplinary artist who crowns his "creative energy" as the sole initiator to his artistic processes and production.

A multi-faceted artist with a passion for figurative and abstract expressionism, Onofua is a visionary who delves deep into the realms of contemporary and modern art.





Adeife Adeniran



Adeife Adeniran (b. 1999) is a visual artist from Lagos, Nigeria, whose paintings and illustrations explore the themes of loneliness and introversion. Through his fictional character, Box Head, Adeniran invites viewers to journey into the inner world of a solitary figure, where imagination, mental states, and reality collide. His work is a captivating blend of fictional narration and

psychological realism, rendered in a comic illustration style that is both simple and minimal. Adeniran's is inspired by a diverse range of influences, including the stark realism of Edward Hopper, the vibrant cartoons of KAWS, and the masked figures of Dennis Osadebe. He also explores the depths of his own experiences and observations of cinema, animation, comics, and

music, crafting intimate yet universal works.

Adeniran holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Visual Arts from the University of Lagos. Nigeria.

Adekepemi Aderemi



Adekepemi Aderemi's career as an artist began with a journey of self-development and improvement by studying and recreating her surroundings in her own way. Through her work Adekepemi has created a context for herself; a space in which she feels comfortable – she finally belongs.

In her debut exhibition, Portals at Alara, Adekepemi's work was characterised by its brooding colours and circular patterns, as she has continued her journey of self-discovery, her evolving mood, attitude and perception of life can easily be seen throughout her new pieces. She favours brighter and bolder colours, whilst she continues to be inspired by the natural world around her (trees, seascapes, sky etc), she is beginning to explore people, man-made structures, buildings, distressed walls, graffiti etc), and journaling has become a huge aspect of her recent works too.

As a textiles graduate from the University of Loughborough School of Art and Design, Adekepemi Aderemi is versed in several art and textiles processes, including drawing, painting, mark-making, machine stitch, and linoleum printing, which all feature heavily in her work. Acrylic paints are also an increasing focal point in her larger works. For example in her recent collection, Woven Threads, the mask-style self portraits painted on the glass are the main subjects, with the framed prints serving as elaborately detailed backgrounds. In addition to these above techniques, Adekepemi has also recently begun producing sculptures, created using wire rods, as well as figure paintings.

With her debut curatorial exhibition, Adekepemi now focuses on figurative expressions, evolving from her usual abstract artistry. In a body of work that commemorates self-development through introspection, this figurative approach encourages viewers to look beyond the self, to the art within.

Adekepemi's work allows her to express herself with an honesty and vulnerability that she would typically have found uncomfortable in real life situations. It is important to her that those who follow her journey and her art see her breakthrough and subsequent development and can resonate with it or even feel a sense of reassurance from frit – it is possible to pull yourself out of these dark spaces. She has done it.
